Players want:

Coaches want:

- No disruption to training schedules
- To minimise the time they have to spend on judiciary matters
- To feel their players are being treated fairly
- To minimise player injuries through dangerous play

Chief Executives want:

- To minimise the time they have to spend on judiciary matters
- To feel their players are being treated fairly
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Financial Managers want:

- To minimise the costs of judiciary – solicitors, witnesses, travel.

Public wants:

- To be confident that the team they follow is being treated equally to other teams
- To see their stars in action every week – not injured or suspended
- To see their own team finish each game with 13 players

Media wants:

- As many opportunities as possible to create controversy.

Game administrators want:

- Public confidence in the system
- A clean play image for the game
- Few if any public controversies about judiciary decisions
- To minimise costs.
